POSITION DESCRIPTION	Certified animal control officers are responsible for enforcing animal laws that have been established by the State of Alabama and will respond to legal complaints by the public and handle complaints according to department protocol and State laws. Animal control officers are legally sworn officers that should be capable of working any animal cruelty or crime scene, and be the key witness in any court trial. Officers should be able to communicate and speak with the public in a professional manner.	
REQUIREMENTS FOR POSITION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ability to respond to and investigate all received calls and complaints. • Ability to patrol county and provide assistance to other officers as needed. • Must possess a valid Alabama driver's license and have a driving record that meets standards set by the county's insurance carrier. • Ability to communicate effectively with staff and public. • Ability to respond to calls and conduct searches as needed. • Secure crimes scenes and assists investigators as needed. • Ability and knowledge to conduct investigations, collect evidence and provide court testimony as needed. • Assist in animal shelter as needed. • Ability to capture and impound dangerous or stray animals. • Ability to cross train with law enforcement. • Must possess required certifications listed below. • Ability to pass all related coursework for certifications and continuing education • Ability to work overtime as needed. 	
EDUCATION	Must possess a high school diploma (or equivalent). Required Certifications: National Training Academy, State Academy, Cruelty Investigations, training to handle dangerous dogs, possess a chemical immobilization certification, possess and maintain euthanasia certification, and possess a valid pistol permit.
